

Religion and Worldviews

We will be exploring the idea that the Kingdom of God is where God rules — not a geographical territory, but in human hearts and minds, lives and communities. Jesus' key teaching in the first three Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) is that he is beginning a kingdom where God's rule of love, forgiveness and inclusion will grow. The children will explore what parables teach us about the kingdom and how this influences Christians. They will also consider how this relates to their own life and what they can learn from the religion.

PSHE

The topic for this term is valuing difference. The children will consider their differences and similarities and the importance of showing tolerance and respect for each other. They will also consider stereotypes and how we can challenge them respectfully.

English

In English, we will be using William Shakespeare as our inspiration, with an initial focus on his play, *Romeo and Juliet*. We will be reading and exploring the text, using it to help us write reports, play scripts and diary entries. The children will also consider the language features used by Shakespeare and how these impact on the reader.

The children will be using their grammatical knowledge, such as, the passive and active voice, to add variety to their writing.

Summer 1 Will's Wonderful words Year 6

PE

Year 6 will continue to keep active this term with a focus on Basketball, and choreographing a dance routine in small groups, linked to *Romeo and Juliet*.

Music

In Music, we will be exploring and identifying the characteristics of film music, which will lead us in to creating a composition and graphic score to perform alongside a film.

Maths

We will be completing our work on geometry, before focusing on position and direction, and statistics, as well as continuing to develop our arithmetic skills and our reasoning skills.
